

Dear Colleagues,

In 1980, a group of Civil Service Unions were concerned about the terrible poverty experienced by those in what was then called the Third World. They decided to form a body which, although modest, could play a part in one way or another, to help eliminate some of this poverty which is rampant throughout the poorest parts of the world. Following initial discussions with the Official Side, and with their support, that body became a reality as the Civil Service Third World Fund. In 1984 it's name was changed to the Combined Services Third World Fund to reflect the establishment of An Post and Telecom Éireann, now eir, and the continuation of contributions to the Fund from staff and pensioners of those companies. The aim of the Fund is to award grants to those most in need to help bring clean water to villages, to establish health clinics, to provide surgical and other equipment for hospitals, extra classrooms for overcrowded schools, and even building small primary schools where none existed before.

The task taken on by the Unions in 1980 was formidable. However, rules were drawn up to enable the Fund to be administered in a proper manner with Advisory and Management Committees, and Trustees. Administrative expenses are kept to a minimum at around 4% of the Fund's income. With the support of the Department of Finance, and various Companies and Agencies, a deduction at source facility allowed many thousands of Public Servants to respond to the call. Many new entrants also go on to become lifelong contributors as Pensioners who continue to support the work of the Fund in their retirement.

Since inception in 1980, the Fund has contributed to hundreds of micro projects throughout the developing world. All of these have proved to be so vital, and life changing, especially in the poorer countries.

The generosity of Staff and Pensioners in supporting the Fund for over forty years knows no bounds. As **Note 2** of this Report shows, their generous support has helped the Fund finance 43 projects during 2019. As ever, we are also grateful for the continuing support of the Unions throughout the years, and in particular to FORSA, for the very generous contribution in 2019 towards the work of the Fund.



The recent flood of donations from Irish people to the appeal of the Navajo Tribes in Monument Valley, Arizona, suffering terribly from Covid -19 is in keeping with the concern of Irish people in general for those in trouble. The Irish people have not forgotten, when in the darkest hour of the Great Famine in 1845, financial help arrived from the Indian tribes who had heard about the famine and desired to help the Irish People.

This year 2020 marks the fortieth anniversary of the Fund. It had been intended to mark the occasion but the Covid - 19 pandemic has put paid to this.

Many of the founders of the Fund have moved on to their eternal reward in the next life and we think of them and their work in particular at this anniversary time. A number of the original founders, to whom we owe our deepest gratitude, still remain at the helm of the Fund and are as active as ever in directing its course in a changed world.

Because of the way the Public Service has changed with reorganisation of Government Departments, the establishment of Companies and Agencies, revised recruitment and payroll arrangements, staff reductions, etc., income has been declining in recent years. While every effort is being made to overcome this through the Annual Report, the Fund's webpage, leaflet distribution, our attendance at courses for staff and pensioners, etc., there is always an urgent need for those same staff and pensioners who may not know about the Fund to consider contributing.

If you read this report, and are not a contributor, please consider doing so by downloading and completing an application form from the Fund webpage www.cstwf.ie It will cost about €20 per year through deduction at source from salary/pension. In doing so you may be helping a child somewhere in our world go to school. You may be helping a mother to receive proper maternity treatment. You may be helping an older person to have a basin of clean water.

Please help the Fund to continue its worthy work into the future by becoming a contributor. For existing contributors please also encourage colleagues to join. Please help in any way you can within your Office or Department to promote the work of the Fund.
